What To Do:

Anyone who witnesses or is subject to any form of harassment as part of a Material Advantage event or activity has two options:

1. At an event site, immediately notify any available society staff member. For example, at the MS&T meeting, staff are located at the registration area, the information booths, or the Society lounges. The staff members will immediately contact the society leadership to assure that you receive a response as soon as possible.
2. Consult the above-referenced individual society policies and determine to which society you prefer to file a report. Follow the guidance provided. A society representative will act promptly. Any action that the society decides as appropriate in response to the report will be honored by the other partners in matters concerning Material Advantage.
